Elm & Oak classes have started to learn about fractions.

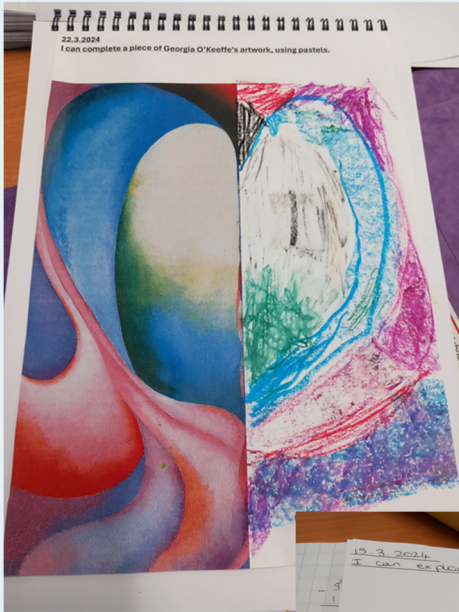
Some students used coloured bears and pizza to show equal and unequal parts



Students made the most of the warmer weather with a trip to the Outdoor Gym at Rutland Water

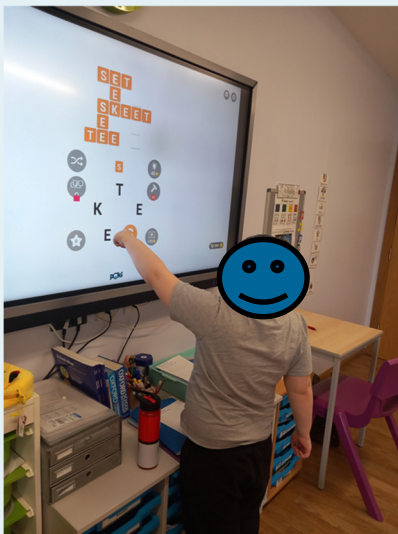
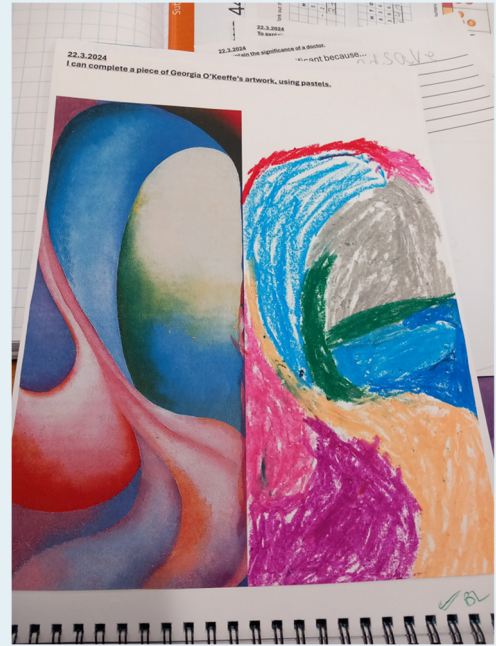
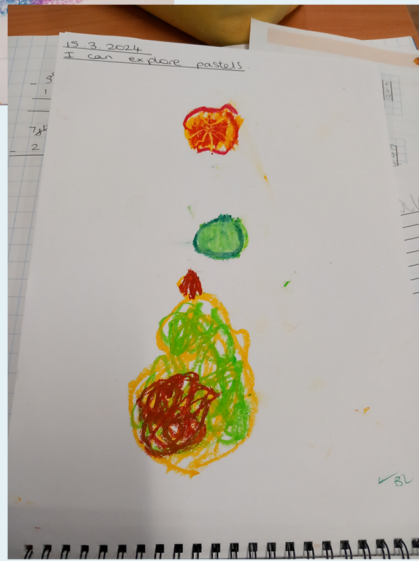


A friendly game of Uno
